The Planning Commission, with certain statutory exceptions, can only take action upon properly posted and listed agenda items.

Unless otherwise noted in the Agenda, the public can only comment on City-related business that is within the subject-matter jurisdiction of the Planning Commission and items listed on the Agenda during the **Public Communications** portion of the meeting. Additionally, the public can comment on any public hearing item on the Agenda during the public hearing portion of such item. The time limit for comments is generally limited to five minutes per person.

Members of the public may request that items be placed on the Agenda by submitting a **Written Request** to the Planning and Building Safety Director at least ten days before the Planning Commission Meeting (by 10:00 a.m. the Monday of the prior week). The request must include a brief general description of the business to be transacted or discussed at the meeting. Playing of video tapes or use of visual aids may be permitted during meetings if they are submitted to the Planning and Building Safety Director a minimum of two working days before the meeting and they do not exceed five minutes in length. Written materials distributed to the Planning Commission within 72 hours of the Planning Commission meeting are available for public inspection immediately upon distribution in the City Clerk's office.

2. <u>Environmental Assessment No. EA-933 and Administrative Use Permit No. 11-08</u>
To allow the sale of beer and wine for on-site consumption (Type 41 ABC License) at a new Bakery Cafe (Schat's Bakery Cafe).

Address: 131 West Grand Avenue, Suite A Applicant(s): David Schat c/o Schat's LLC

Business Name: Schat's Bakery Cafe

Owner(s): Doheny Enerprises, LLC/ 612 Twin Holdings, LLC

The applicant requests the approval for an Administrative Use Permit (AUP) to allow the sale of beer and wine (Type 41 ABC) License at a new bakery and cafe at 131 West Grand Avenue, Suite A. The project site is located in the Grand Avenue District (GAD) within the Downtown Specific Plan (DSP).

The applicant proposes a 199 square-foot outdoor dining area in front of the building that will contain 6 seats and an 893 square-foot interior area that will contain 16 seats. The combined total area of the restaurant is 3,854 square feet. The applicant proposes a combined total of 25 seats and is requesting to operate Monday through Sunday from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. No outdoor entertainment is proposed and the sale of alcohol in the two dining areas will be limited to the same hours as the bakery and café.

The proposed project is categorically exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to 14 California Code of Regulations § 15301 as a Class 1 categorical exemption (Existing Facilities). The project includes an alcohol license for an existing commercial lease space which results in a minor alteration in the operation of an existing building. The project is not anticipated to have any significant impacts with regard to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality. There are adequate utilities and public services to serve the project.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: The recommended action is for the Planning Commission to Receive and File the Director's approval of Administrative Use Permit No. 11-08.

3. South Bay Bicycle Master Plan (Environmental Assessment No. EA-938)

Address: Citywide
Applicant(s): City Initiated
Property Owner: Various

The City of El Segundo is participating in a regional planning effort to develop and maintain a comprehensive bicycle network and set of programs for the South Bay region. The goal of this effort is to produce a South Bay Bicycle Master Plan (SBBMP) for the seven participating cities. The seven South Bay cities participating in the planning effort are: El Segundo, Gardena, Hermosa Beach, Lawndale, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach and Torrance. This effort is coordinated by the South Bay Bicycle Coalition, an advocacy group engaged in improving bicycle infrastructure and developing and facilitating implementation of policies to ensure cycling safety and convenience. Funding for this effort is provided by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health under its RENEW program (Renew Environments for Nutrition, Exercise and Wellness).

Coordination meetings among the seven participating cities and a consultant team (ALTA Planning + Design) began in the Fall of 2010, with the objective of completing the planning process in the Fall of 2011 and starting the implementation phase by 2012.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Planning Commission: (1) open the public hearing and take documentary and testimonial evidence; (2) after considering the evidence adopt Resolution No. 2702; and/or (3) discuss and take any other action related to this item.

4. Environmental Assessment No. 717, MISC 11-05

Determination of Consistency of the Vacation of a Water Easement with the City of El Segundo General Plan

Address: 616-620 West Imperial Avenue

Applicant: City of El Segundo

Property Owners: Olsen – El Segundo 1, LLC

The proposed project is a request that the Planning Commission review the proposed disposition of real property and find that a City abandonment of a water easement is consistent with the El Segundo General Plan.

The proposed water easement vacation is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code §§ 21000, et seq., "CEQA") and CEQA regulations (14 California Code of Regulations §§ 15000, et seq.) because it does not constitute a "project" that requires environmental review (see specifically 14 CCR § 21065).

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Planning Commission (1) open the public hearing and take documentary and testimonial evidence; (2) after considering the evidence adopt Resolution No. 2704; and (3) discuss and take any other action related to this item.

5. Environmental Assessment No. 861 and Zone Text Amendment No. 10-01

Zone Text Amendment to amend Title 15 of the El Segundo Municipal Code (ESMC) to establish a chapter regulating dedication and improvement of public rights-of-way.

Address: Citywide

Applicant: City of El Segundo

Property Owners: Various

The proposed project is an Environmental Assessment and a Zone Text Amendment to add a new Chapter 15-24A to the El Segundo Municipal Code regulating dedication and improvement of public rights-of-way.

The proposed ordinance is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code §§ 21000, et seq., "CEQA") and CEQA regulations (14 California Code of Regulations §§ 15000, et seq.) because it does not involve any commitment to a specific project which could result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment; and establishes rules and procedures to implement an organizational or administrative activity that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Accordingly, this Ordinance does not constitute a "project" that requires environmental review (see specifically 14 CCR § 15378(b)(2, 5)).

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Planning Commission: (1) continue the item to the September 22, 2011 meeting.
