BURGLARY ARRESTS ON THE RISE

Between Thursday, August 30, 2012 and Sunday, September 2, 2012, El Segundo Officers arrested the above suspects for individual and separate burglaries that occurred in our city. Three of the suspects had extensive criminal records, one with arrests in other states, and two who were on active parole from the California state prison system. With the passage of AB109 (realignment), which was implemented in October 2011, many prison inmates have been released back into south bay communities and continue to be released on a monthly basis. Due in part to difficult economic times, reduced police resources and increased criminal offenders on the streets, El Segundo has seen a rise in reported property crimes. Residents are asked to be especially vigilant and report

suspicious activity or persons in their neighborhoods. Residents are also reminded to secure their homes and vehicles, especially when left unattended. Between the evening hours of September 1st and the morning of September 2nd, El Segundo Officers responded to eleven thefts from parked vehicles, most of which were left unsecured.

The El Segundo Police Department continues to proactively impact crime through directed patrol tactics, specialized deployments, apprehension of suspects, and public education and awareness efforts. We are asking that every citizen do their part in helping to fight crime by taking both preventative action and spreading the word about this mounting problem. Working together we can make a difference.
