Members of the Public may place items on the Agenda by submitting a Written Request to the Director of Public Works/City Engineer at least six (6) days prior to the Environmental Committee meeting. The request must include a brief general description of the business to be transacted or discussed at the meeting. Playing of videotapes or use of visual aids may be permitted during meetings if they are submitted to the Director of Public Works/City Engineer two (2) working days prior to the meeting and they do not exceed five (5) minutes in length.
